Chattey Road Reconstruction Project

The reconstruction of Chattey Road is included in the City of DeSoto's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). Currently, Chattey Road is a two-lane asphalt roadway located within a residential community. There is with heavy pedestrian school traffic along Chattey Road and there are no sidewalks. Chattey Road will be reconstructed from Pleasant Run Road to Belt Line Road and will include a 25 foot residential concrete roadway with curb and gutter, closed underground drainage, sidewalks, retaining walls, landscaping and lighting.

The design phase of the proposed project is complete. The proposed horizontal alignment will have few changes. However, the new vertical alignment will improve sight distances when traveling along the street.

In order to accommodate the proposed construction, additional street right-ofway and easements were necessary. All needed right-of-way and easements have been acquired from private property owners.

Before construction, franchise utility companies such as phone, cable, electric are being relocated outside of the proposed roadway surface and proposed infrastructure improvements. These relocations are expected to be complete by January 2019. Bids for reconstruction of Chattey Road were received in October, 2018 and construction is expected to begin in February, 2019.

Public meetings will be held in the coming weeks designed to provide information about the actual

construction phase of the project and how it will affect the surrounding neighborhoods. Watch this newsletter for future updates. For more information, please call 972.230.7309.







Settlers came to our area in 1847. After World War II, DeSoto and surrounding areas began to grow. In order to improve an inadequate water distribution system, residents felt the need to incorporate the town. On February 17, 1949, a petition signed by 42 eligible voters was presented to the Dallas County judge requesting an election for incorporation. The vote took place on March 2nd. Of the 52 people who cast ballots, 50 voted in favor of incorporation and 2 were opposed. The results were entered into the records of the Dallas County Commissioners Court, thereby creating the City of DeSoto. Almost 70 years later, DeSoto is a thriving and vibrant community with more than 53,000 residents.

A Message From Code **Enforcement**

The City's Garbage, Trash and Refuse Ordinance specifies a timeframe for when trash and recyclables can be placed at the curb for pickup. In order to minimize wildlife disturbing the refuse or other elements coming in contact with plastic bags or containers, residential refuse and recyclables shall not be placed at the curb before 6 pm the day before collection day.

"This amendment addresses problems resulting from trash being put out at the curb or in the alley for pick-up a day or more prior to the actual collection time," said Tracie Hlavinka, DeSoto Deputy City Manager. "When trash is allowed to sit on the curb, it attracts animals who tear into the bags and scatter it."

To guarantee your trash is not missed by Republic Services, please have your trash and recyclables at the curb or placed in the alley no later than 7 am on the day of collection. All residents who live west of Hampton Road have their trash collected on Tuesdays and Fridays. Those living east of Hampton Road have their trash collected on Mondays and Thursdays. All recycle bins, throughout the City, are emptied on Wednesdays.

If you have large/bulky items such as furniture, mattresses and appliances they should be places out for pick-up with your regular trash on the second collection day of the week. Tires, batteries and other hazardous waste are not allowed in our landfill and must be disposed of properly. Construction materials are not excepted. Loose brush and fencing material must be placed on your front curb for pick-up. If you have any questions or would like to report a code violation, please call 469.658.3075.
