Grow DeSoto Market Place Wins Award/Mayor McCowan Receives
Recognition

The North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG), an association of North Texas governments that assists with regional planning efforts, provided the City of DeSoto with some wonderful news on Friday, June 14, 2019.

NCTCOG awarded their "Celebrating Leadership in Development Excellence (CLIDE) Award" to the Grow DeSoto Market Place for exemplifying one or more of their Principles of Development Excellence. They also declared that Grow DeSoto serves as an example of Development Excellence in the North Central Texas Region.

The Grow DeSoto Market Place is the product of a public-private partnership between the DeSoto Economic Development Corporation (DeSoto EDC), the City of DeSoto, the DeSoto Chamber of Commerce, Options Real Estate, and The Industry Hub. This partnership is credited with successfully transforming a shuttered hardware store into a thriving facility that now serves as DeSoto's small business incubator. Grow DeSoto, which celebrated its

grand opening in October 2018, provides shoppers in DeSoto and the region with a wide variety of unique retail shops, services, restaurants, and a full-service fitness and rehabilitation center.

"The Grow DeSoto Market Place symbolizes the creative rebirth of our small business community and serves as an

example to many other cities that the closure of old businesses in a community can present bold new opportunities that can ultimately make a positive difference within a city!" stated DeSoto Mayor Curtistene McCowan.

Mayor McCowan, who presently serves on The North Central Texas Council of Governments Board of Directors, also received some great news from NCTCOG. She has been selected to serve as the board's Secretary-Treasurer for 2019-2020. Said Mayor McCowan, "I am honored to play an even bigger role in this great organization which has helped to change the face of the North Texas region for the better!"

DeSoto's Municipal Court Offers Several Ways to Resolve Outstanding Warrants

Persons who have received traffic citations from the DeSoto Police Department have the option to resolve those citations through a video conference court appearance, Municipal Court Manager Jeremy Leonard announced recently.

"This initiative makes it far more convenient for defendants to resolve their traffic citations with the DeSoto Municipal Court."

DeSoto's Municipal Court Judge Scott Kurth holds an E-Court



docket each day at 11 am (except for the 4th Wednesday of the month). The process is very user friendly: simply go to the Court's website at www.desototexas.gov/court and click on VIDEO CONFERENCE THE JUDGE for instructions on how E-Court works and what options are available to you on E-Court.

When you are ready to meet with the Judge using E-Court, you will go to https://zoom.us/join where you will be asked to download the "zoom" app. Once the app is downloaded to your pc or mobile device, you will type in the meeting ID 582-661-129 that will immediately establish a video conference with Judge Kurth.

YOU CAN ALSO COME IN PERSON TO TALK TO THE JUDGE ABOUT YOUR WARRANTS

You can also see Judge Kurth in person every business day beginning at 10:30 am. If you have a new citation or old warrants out of the DeSoto Municipal Court, come and discuss them with Judge Kurth. He has an open docket every business day (i.e. Monday through Friday) beginning at 10:30 am. Be smart and avoid jail on your warrants! Judge Kurth will not have anyone arrested on traffic warrants inside the Town Center. Take advantage of this opportunity to work out a plan to resolve your warrants and avoid the inconvenience and embarrassment of being arrested.

METHODS OF PAYING TRAFFIC CITATIONS

You can pay your citations in person at the Municipal Court Window on Monday through Friday from 8 am until 5 pm. You can also make a payment by phone by calling TrafficPayment.com at 800.444.1187 or going online to www.trafficpayment.com. If you have loved ones in jail and want to have them released by paying their fines and costs, you can call GovPayNet at 888.604.7888 and make payment of the amount owing.

Did You Know? ...

That the City's Garbage, Trash and Refuse Ordinance specifies a timeframe for when trash and recyclables can be placed at the curb for pickup? In order to minimize wildlife disturbing the refuse or other elements coming in contact with plastic bags or containers, residential refuse and recyclables shall not be placed at the curb before 6 pm the day before collection day.

"This item in the ordinance addresses problems resulting from trash being put out at the curb or in the alley for pick-up a day or more prior to the actual collection time," said Charles Humphrey, Code "When trash is Enforcement Manager. allowed to sit on the curb, it attracts animals who tear into the bags and scatter it."

To guarantee your trash is not missed by Republic Services, please have your trash and recyclables in the alley or, if you don't have an alley, placed at the curb no later than 7 am on the day of collection. residents who live west of Hampton Road have their trash collected on Tuesdays and Fridays. Those living east of Hampton Road have their trash collected on Mondays and Thursdays. All recycle bins, throughout the City, are emptied on Wednesdays.

DeSoto's Code Enforcement Department would like to remind residents that all garbage must be placed in a plastic refuse bag for garbage pick up. This picture shows some garbage in bags and some loose

garbage in the container. All garbage must be bagged to avoid having loose garbage scattered when the containers are being emptied into the truck. The Ordinance stipulates that residential customers shall utilize a plastic refuse bag that is designed and sold for the purpose of placing garbage, trash, or refuse in it for disposal. If your trash is not bagged, the solid waste contractor will tag the container and leave the trash to be bagged for removal. Habitual offenders of the Garbage, Trash and Refuse Ordinance will be fined. Trash and recycling bags are available for purchase at the Utility Billing window in City Hall. Trash bags are \$9.56 for a roll of 50 and recycle bags are \$6.65 for a roll of 50 bags.
