## Did You Know.....

That a toilet leak left undetected and uncorrected for any length of time can result in both a huge loss of water and money? The American Water Works Association estimates toilets account for 45 percent of total water use in a typical household and that 20 percent of them leak. In just one year, a leaky toilet can waste over 22,000 gallons of water. If your bill has been creeping steadily higher, you could have a leak caused by one of the following problems: Water Trickling Into the Bowl, or "Phantom Flushes"

You may periodically hear your toilet begin to spontaneously refill, as though someone had flushed it. A toilet that cuts on and off by itself, or runs intermittently, has a problem that plumbers call a phantom flush. This is often the hardest problem to detect. Generally, it is caused by a deteriorated or defective flush valve (flapper) ball at the bottom of the toilet tank. If the flapper or ball valve does not seat properly and form a water tight seal, water will leak around it into the toilet bowl and down the sewer. The flapper valve should be replaced every 3 to 5 years. Most hardware, plumbing and home improvement stores supply flappers.

### Water Trickling Into the Tank

If you hear a sustained hissing sound coming from your toilet, it's probably the result of water trickling into the tank via the supply line. This can be caused by an improperly adjusted or broken fill (ball cock) valve. If the float is set too high or if the shut-off valve fails to close completely, water will continue to enter the tank and flow into the overflow tube. This type of leak can be seen simply by taking the tank top off and observing if water is flowing into the overflow tube once the tank is full. Float balls occasionally need to be adjusted or replaced. They can also be easily fixed with replacement parts from the local hardware or home improvement store.

## The Bowl Empties Slowly

A bowl that empties slowly — also known as a weak flush — is usually the result of clogged holes underneath the rim of the bowl. You may want to contact a plumber to verify and repair the leak. Or if you consider yourself an experienced "do-it-yourselfer", use a curved piece of wire to poke gently into each flush hole to clear out any debris. Coat-hanger wire works fine, and a small mirror will help you see under the rim. You can also use wire to loosen debris that may be blocking the siphon jet in the bottom of the drain. Be careful not to scratch the bowl.

## The Dreaded Clog

Clogs are the most common toilet problems.

## Did You Know....(cont.)

Several tools can clear a clogged drain, but some repairs are best left to the professionals. If you suspect you have a clogged toilet, consult a plumber.

## Leaky Seals

A standard toilet has at least five seals with the potential for leaking. In each case, the solution is to identify the faulty seal and tighten or replace it. The largest seal is the one between the tank and bowl. A break here will cause a major leak, with water spraying from underneath the tank at every flush. The final seal is the wax seal mounted on a plastic flange underneath the toilet base. If this seal fails, water leaking underneath the toilet base will eventually rot the floor. Caulking around the base of the toilet without repairing the leak will only trap the water, making matters worse. Contact a qualified, licensed plumber to detect and repair this type of leak.

A simple leak check can be performed using toilet tank leak detector tablets which are available free of charge to DeSoto Water Utilities customers. Please visit the Utility Billing Department located in City Hall to request the tablets. For more information regarding your water service, please call 972.230.9627.

## Code Enforcement.....It's Everyone's Job

**Junk Vehicles** - City Ordinance requires that you maintain your property free of any junk motor vehicles. A junk motor vehicle is any vehicle that is inoperative and remains inoperative for more than 45 days or is inoperative and does not have a current registration sticker or inspection sticker. A junk motor vehicle is also any vehicle which is wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled or discarded. These vehicles may not be visible anywhere in the public view, public right-of-way, street or on any other private property.

DeSoto Code Enforcement is stepping up enforcement on inoperable vehicles around the city. In the past, a door hanger was



left on the residence where the vehicle was parked asking that it be moved. Now a certified letter and a first class mail letter will be sent to the resident stating that if the vehicle is not moved in 10 days, Code Enforcement will pursue securing a court order to have the vehicle towed.

**Downed Fences** - City Ordinance requires that the fence on your property be maintained at all times. It is unlawful to allow your fence to lean or to have missing, loose or broken slats or panels. It is also prohibited to have barbed wire, hog wire, or chicken wire or to have an electric fence.

The fence is not allowed to have any symbols, writings or other graffiti except for signs which pertain to the address or occupancy of the property. (If you find graffiti on your fence, report it to the Police Department at 469-658-3000 and volunteers from the Citizens On

Patrol will clean up the graffiti at no cost to you.)

If you have a swimming pool, a fence, structure or gate is required to completely surround the swimming pool to prevent small children from inadvertently wandering into the pool. This fence,



structure or gate shall not be lower then (6) six feet in height, and not have any openings that will allow a four-inch diameter sphere to pass through. All such gates should have a self-closing and self-latching device designed to keep gates closed and locked at all times.

A permit is required to build any fence on your property and can be obtained from the Building Inspection Department at City Hall, 211 E. Pleasant Run Rd. or by calling 972. 230.9610.

## Answers To Your Questions Regarding How Your Sewer Charges Are Calculated

## How are winter sewer averages calculated for residential customers?

Each year, residential customers have their monthly water consumption during the winter months averaged to establish a maximum sewer charge. We take the water consumption shown on your December, January, February and March billings, discard the two highest months and average the remaining two months to establish the maximum sewer charge that will be used from April of that year through the following March. For example: if your water usage is 10,000 gallons in December, 15,000 gallons in January, 8,000 gallons in February and 6,000 gallons in March, the new average is 7,000 gallons. The December and January bills would be discarded because they are the two highest of the four months and the remaining February and March billings would be averaged.

## Why do you average only two of the four winter months?

Lawn sprinkling, entertaining guests during the holidays, filling a swimming pool or having a toilet leak, for example, can all increase a monthly bill. Being able to discard the two largest of these water bills prior to averaging the two remaining months gives a more accurate measure of water going into the sewer system.

Once I have my average, does this mean I will be charged this same amount every month?

This is a maximum charge. You will not be charged more, but you could be charged less. If your average water usage is 8,000 gallons and you only use 5,000 gallons of water one month, you will be billed for 5,000 gallons of sewer.

#### Why do you use the winter months for averaging?

Normally residential customers are not watering their lawns during this time period and all of the water usage is inside the house. Generally this is the time of the year that the majority of the water is going down the sewer system. If you operate your irrigation system year round, it would be advisable to have a separate meter for watering your lawn so that the water used on your lawn would not calculate into the winter average.

## What is my average if I am a new customer and do not have a winter months' history?

All new residential customers receive a 7,000 gallons average until they have established their history during the winter months. Remember that is the maximum and the charge is less if your water consumption is less.


